READ **2 SAMUEL 9:1-7** share takeaways from the passage & sermon.

QUESTIONS & DISCUSSION

Q 01. Mephibosheth lived in Lo-debar—a place of "nothingness" or shame— until the king brought him to the table to restore his honor and inheritance. Everyone has had a "Lo-debar season."

What's one way God has brought you out of a hard place and reminded you that you belong at His table?

Q 02. When David says to Mephibosheth, "Don't be afraid... for I will surely show you kindness... and you will always eat at my table" (2 Samuel 9:7), it reveals God's eternal hesed (HEH-sed)—His loyal, faithful, covenant love that welcomes us to share in His kindness forever.

Who do you feel that the Holy Spirit is asking you to prepare a table of kindness for?

Q 03. When David "had Mephibosheth brought from Lo-debar" (2 Samuel 9:5), the crippled son of Jonathan couldn't come to the king on his own—David had to carry him. This shows how God meets us in our weakness and brings us to His table by His strength alone.

What areas of your life are fear or pride keeping you from receiving God's kindness and grace?

Final Reflection: Like Mephibosheth, we are carried by God's mercy, raised through Jesus' strength, and reminded—as Mica's name declares—that "there is no one like Yahweh" who restores the broken.
