## QUESTIONS & DISCUSSION

**Ice Breaker:** *What's a skill or hobby you admire in others that you wish you had more time to develop?*

*The rich fool in Luke 12:16-12 "lays up treasure for himself and is not rich towards God."*

**Q 01. What stands out to you in this parable, and is there anything about it that challenges or even offends you?**

*Where we place our treasure shapes our hearts, and as stewards of what God has entrusted to us, generosity grows our love for what we invest in.*

**Q 02. How have you experienced your heart grow through giving, and in what ways has it shifted your focus away from self or materialism?**

*2 Corinthians 9:11 reminds us that we are blessed so we can be generous. God's provision is never meant to stop with us—wealth is not the goal, but generosity is. The bible also warns us about the danger of loving money, which can distort our priorities and pull our hearts away from God.*

**Q 03. Where might you be experiencing God's "lightning" (His grace and provision), and how is it shaping your "thunder" of generosity?**

*The Treasure Principle reminds us that we can't take earthly wealth with us, but we can invest it ahead of time by living with eternity in mind. 1 Timothy 6:17–19 gives a kingdom perspective on wealth, reminding us that everything we have comes from God and is meant to be used generously.*

**Q 04. Which do you tend to lean toward more: living as if this life is the main focus, or living with eternity in view?**
