QUESTIONS & DISCUSSION

Ice Breaker: Who's someone you're really glad didn't give up on you and why?

In Mark 2:4, the friends didn't let a full house or a roof stop them—they found a way to get their friend to Jesus.

Q 01. When you've felt prompted to 'bring someone to Jesus', do you usually step in or hang back? What tends to make you hesitate, and how does the bystander effect show up in your life?

Jesus didn't just heal the paralytic—He met his deepest need: forgiveness. His friends simply brought him to Jesus, showing that our faith and action can open the door for others to encounter Him.

Q 02. If our job is just to bring people to Jesus—not fix them—how would that change the way you invest in others?

Q 03. If your actions might be the only way someone experiences Jesus, how would that change the way you live, the way you speak, or the people you choose to invest in?

1 Corinthians 3:6–7 reminds us that we may plant the seed, but God makes it grow. Our job isn't to control the outcome—it's to be faithful in obedience.

Q 04. Who is one person God is prompting you to reach out to, even if they seem far away or have said 'no' before—and what could one step of faith toward them look like?
